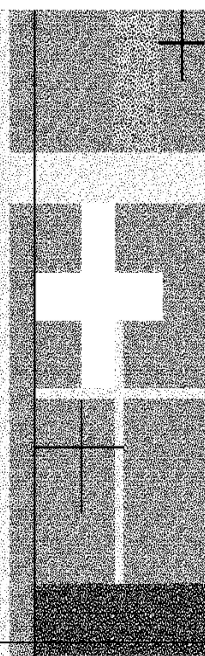

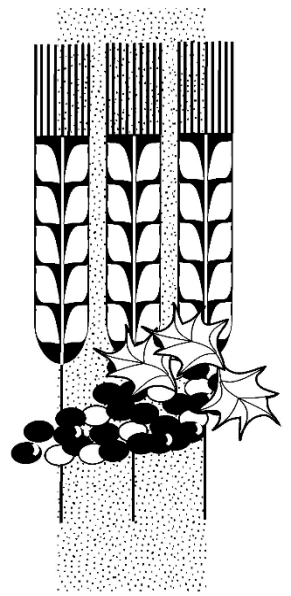

Dear parishioners and visitors,

Where did the summer go? I hope it has been a pleasant, restful, healthy one for you and your loved ones. And there are still flowers to enjoy, leaves on the trees to shade us from lingering summer heat, the long weekend still to come with its promise of last-minute family gatherings and BBQs....

A new chapter and season begins for us at Holy Rosary Cathedral, as **we welcome our new Pastor, Fr. Amédée Ainemon**, who started his tenure with us at the beginning of this month. When you have the time, do introduce yourselves to him after Mass---or drop in at his office. It will be helpful for him to get to know us, to come to know our culture and our vibrant spirit of volunteerism, to know that he can rely on us for whatever help he needs in his ministry of our parish.

On Tuesday, the Parish Council meets for the first time post-summer hiatus---- the Finance Council a couple of weeks later.

As always, there are plans "a-foot" for various parish activities. Topmost is our turn to organize a Downtown Saturday Lunch, on September 5. The Social Justice Committee is asking **for badly needed items** which you can **drop-off in the blue donation barrel in the main entrances of the church**: socks, toothbrushes, toothpaste, small tissue-packages, toilet paper rolls, soap, shampoo, toques, mittens, scarves, new underwear for men and women, women's personal hygiene products (including sanitary napkins and tampons). These will be made available at the lunch. If you are strapped for time to shop, you may also make a monetary donation at the office (for which you will receive an income tax receipt) -- which will be used to purchase the needed items.

Next is the annual **Treasure Trove** on **Saturday, September 12--9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.**--in the Cathedral Hall. This is the third year that Bernadette and her Social Justice Committee have organized this community event. Anyone who wishes to rent a table to sell his or her wares (old or new) should **contact Bernadette at 306-537-4158**. There are still vacant tables going, if you or others you know wish to rent one. This is an important fund-raiser for the Committee--- the money going towards the different out-reaching activities they organize to help those in our city who are in need. It is also a chance for the community to gather--- for us to possibly pick up early Christmas presents, and to chat with friends and neighbours. There will be antique items, beautiful hand- crafts, CDs, surprise rummage finds--- AND bake goods, special treats. (You can also enjoy a simple lunch of hot dog/chips/a drink for \$5 (!)

Please also consider volunteering to be an **Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion or Lector**: very significant - and rewarding- ministries in our parish. Please get in touch with **Joanne Skidmore (306-581-4415)**. No need for previous experience; training will be provided!

(So many "pleases"! Thank you for your patience and understanding...!)

We welcome a new member to our office team---Chelo Ravasco ---our bookkeeper. We are grateful to Sister Amelia, who had taken on the position temporarily the last two years, since the retirement of John Hoffman. We are also in the process of hiring an Office Assistant. Our thanks and best wishes to Stefanie who had that position this past year, and who has now secured a full-time position in Nursing.

Thank you all for your patience in dealing with the inconvenience brought on by the infrastructure work on Cameron Street. We should have our regular parking lot entrance back shortly.

Thank you for your continuing financial support of our parish. We are pleased to announce that your donations to date (\$238, 072) is keeping us **almost close** on the path of a balanced budget this year. We have a few more months to see us in the black.

As to the **Rebuilding Campaign**, you will be happy to know that the plans for the new spires on our church have been defined, and their replacement will be completed by late Fall of 2027. There will be movement starting in the interior of the two towers next week, with work we may not notice much, and which will be completed by early November of this year. Next: the construction of the new spires which will actually occur on our parking lot - starting in February, and to be completed by November 2027. The old spires will then be removed by cranes, and the new ones lifted and put in place also by cranes! "Parishioners and visitors will have a front row seat to watch the progress", according to John Dipple, the lead in this Campaign, and for whose time and energy and dedication to this project we owe much.

One cannot help but think of the dozens of masons and carpenters who erected the original spires a hundred years ago! Carrying bricks one by one up ladders, securing them delicately, risking their lives....

We have inherited this magnificent building, a work of love and of faith----it is our heritage, handed down by previous generations. It is our responsibility to preserve it for future generations. And so, the fund-raising campaign continues, as we plan the next phase of the restoration work on the sewer/electrical infrastructure of the building and the refurbishing of our much-used Hall and kitchen. Stay tuned...!

Responding rapidly to the Colombia earthquake, **Development and Peace — Caritas Canada** (DPCC) is making an **initial allocation of \$50,000** to help local partners, including Cáritas Colombiana, respond to the emergency. We also join Pope Leo XIV in **his expression of sorrow**, in consoling the victims and in praying for the survivors.

A telegram sent on his behalf to the Colombian Bishops' Conference (see **text in Spanish**) conveyed the Holy Father's prayer to our Lord to "pour out upon the beloved Colombian people the gifts of spiritual strength and Christian hope." Now, we are calling Canadians to be the vehicles of that Christian hope by **giving generously to help the survivors of the Colombia earthquake**.

At 7:34 a.m. local time on Monday, August 10, 2026, a magnitude 7.4 earthquake struck the municipality of San José del Palmar, in the Chocó Department in western Colombia. While the worst effects are in the departments of Chocó, Valle del Cauca, Risaralda, Quindío and Caldas, impacts have been reported in half of the country's 32 departments.

A day later, the official toll stood at 2,595 people injured and 224 killed, with the most fatalities occurring in Cali, Colombia's third-largest city.

Colombia appears on the International Rescue Committee's **2026 Emergency Watchlist** of the 20 countries at the greatest risk of new or worsening humanitarian emergencies. With **over 7 million people internally displaced** and 6.9 million people in need of aid, Colombia already had its hands full when this quake hit Chocó.

Although the country has recently made significant strides in alleviating poverty, Chocó remains one of its poorest departments. Two in three residents, the vast majority of whom are Afro-Colombian or Indigenous, **live in poverty**, and **child mortality rates are twice as high as elsewhere in Colombia**. The factors underpinning this impoverishment—isolation, historic marginalization, an underdeveloped economy and the legacies of civil conflict—will complicate the response to and the recovery from this earthquake.

Over DPCC's decades-long presence in Colombia, we have forged strong links with some very capable partners. Cáritas Colombiana, in particular, has a vast and deep countrywide network of thousands of grassroots professionals and volunteers that it has already mobilized. Command posts have been activated in Bogotá, Quibdó, Armenia, and Cali to coordinate relief efforts.

They will begin with addressing people's most urgent needs, including for food, water, shelter, clothing, hygiene supplies, medication, etc. Later, systematic needs assessments will inform longer-term rebuilding, recovery and rehabilitation efforts.

While our partners' capabilities are abundant, this gargantuan task will take more resources than they have on hand. That is why they need your solidarity now. **You can help them by giving generously to support the people of Colombia.**

Parents and Community Take Legal Action to Reverse Closure of Regina Early Learning Centre

For nearly fifty years, the Regina Early Learning Centre, located on Athol Street a block from Holy Rosary Cathedral, has quietly supported generations of children and families through programs designed to help them thrive.

What began in 1977 as an innovative preschool program grew from a simple belief: every child deserves the opportunity to succeed, and every family deserves support.

At a time when early childhood education was only beginning to be acknowledged, the Centre's founder, Anne Luke, recognized that learning starts long before kindergarten. Children flourish through caring adults, stable relationships, opportunities to play, and communities that believe in their potential.

Under Anne Luke's determination and vision, plus the dedication of staff, volunteers, board members, and community partners, the Regina Early Learning Centre evolved far beyond a preschool classroom.

The organization expanded to meet families where they were. Home visiting programs supported parents raising young children, helping caregivers build confidence and practical skills during some of their most challenging years, while parenting programs strengthened connection and resilience. The Early Years Family Resource Centre became a welcoming place for families to gather, play, learn, and build community, fostering friendships and support networks that extended beyond its walls. Partnerships united health, education, and social service providers around a shared goal: giving children the strongest possible start in life.

Today, the Regina Early Learning Centre (RELC) is facing closure. On June 24, the Board announced that it is replacing the RELC with a federally funded full-time child daycare program.

Parents are angry that this decision, taken without consultation of the members of this 49-year-old educational organization, has left dozens of young students unable to complete the program they had begun last September, and which they were pre-registered to resume this fall, prior to entering kindergarten.

Following several ignored overtures through the winter and spring to discuss the lack of parent Board members or a Parent Advisory Committee, as well as a seemingly blackout of information about financial challenges facing the Preschool Program, RELC parents initiated legal action in June to challenge the legitimacy of the Board. A meeting is scheduled for Friday, September 4 at 7:00 pm. at the Regina Early Learning Centre to elect a new board with the intention of bringing back the preschool program.

September would normally mark the beginning of the RELC Preschool's 50th year of operations, had the Board not made the decision to terminate it. In the meantime, RELC parents and supporters, concerned that the Board will try to make such a significant change without the knowledge and support of the current members of the organization, continue to meet and identify a team of new board members to restore the Preschool Program, to rebuild trust, integrity and financial stability of the organization, and prepare for the 50th anniversary in the fall of 2027.

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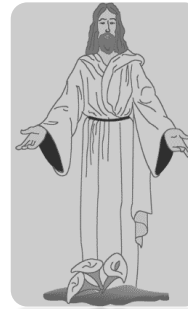
