



WEEK THREE OF REVERENCE FOR LIFE MONTH.

Theme: Accompany One Another in Love

This week, we reflect on what it means to truly walk with others in their suffering. Jesus never turned away from those who were sick, lonely, or grieving. He stayed. He calls us to do the same.

Many people choose Euthanasia/MAiD not because of physical pain, but because of emotional distress, loneliness, or fear of being burdensome. There are even vulnerable people being offered MAiD even when they have not asked for it. In moments of fear or isolation, this message can deepen despair.

The good news is that we live in the hope of Easter, celebrating Christ's victory over death and the promise of new life. No one should suffer alone.

What Can We Do?

Reach out to someone who may be feeling forgotten. A visit, a phone call, or a quiet moment of prayer can bring comfort and restore dignity. We also encourage you to explore the Canadian Conference of Bishops' video series "Horizon of Hope" and the CMDA Canada video series "Dying with Christ, Living with Hope." This gentle resource helps us learn what real accompaniment looks like and how to bring it into our relationships and communities.

TAIZE PRAYER

"Right at the depth of the human condition, lies the longing for a presence, the silent desire for a communion. Let us never forget that this simple desire for God is already the beginning of faith."

The Taizé Community is an ecumenical Christian monastic community in Taizé, France, founded in 1940 by Brother Roger. It is known for promoting peace, reconciliation, and unity among Christians, particularly youth. Taizé prayer is characterized by simplicity, silence, and meditative chants. Short, repetitive songs—often in multiple languages—create a contemplative atmosphere that invites deep reflection and inner stillness. The prayer includes readings from scripture, extended periods of silence, and candlelight, fostering a serene, spiritual space. This style of worship encourages a personal encounter with God, drawing people of various backgrounds into a shared experience of peace and unity. This will be held at Blessed Sacrament at 5 p.m. Tuesdays, May 20, 27 and June 3. All are welcome.


